



What is Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)?

PrEP is a daily medication for HIV-negative people that is highly effective at preventing HIV. PrEP can be a helpful and self-controlled HIV prevention tool for women, including those who have an HIV-positive partner who is not on treatment or has a detectable viral load, have multiple sex partners, do not always use condoms, and/or sometimes share equipment when using drugs.

PrEPstart provides three months of free PrEP for people who do not have drug coverage. This allows you to start PrEP right away while you explore drug coverage options.

To enroll with PrEPstart:



1. See a health care provider for a standard PrEP assessment, including HIV and STBBI testing (see back for info on how).
2. Once you have been assessed and have your test results, ask your health care provider to complete the PrEPstart prescription form available at Ontarioprep.ca/PrEPstart and fax it to the program pharmacy.
3. The pharmacy will fill your prescription and it will be available for pick-up or delivery.
4. Visit Ontarioprep.ca/pay to see the different options for ongoing drug coverage.
